

As-salāmu 'alaykum,

We are still in a state of shock from the tragic events that occurred in Christchurch nearly two weeks ago. On behalf of all the staff at Boulcott School, our deepest condolences to our families that may have lost loved ones in this attack, some of you especially may be directly connected to the Muslim families in Christchurch. Through incredible sadness there has been wonderful stories of kindness and unity across the nation. This was our focus at Boulcott last week, especially last Friday, where we all stopped at lunchtime to observe the 2 minutes of silence. This was a time to reflect and think about our own loved ones and how we can demonstrate kindness and aroha to others around us.

On Monday of Week 11 (8th April) we're going to have our own 'Unity Day'. We'll ask students and staff to wear bright colours and to bring a gold coin donation for the 'Our People, Our City' fund set up by the Christchurch City Council to support families affected by last weeks tragedy. The children will be involved in creating a collaborative art piece for our school foyer to express their aroha.

Some of you may have been aware that all schools in Christchurch were placed in Lock Down during March 15th. All reports from these schools noted how well the staff and students coped during this challenging time; many hours contained in their classroom. Please be reassured we have some robust processes in place at Boulcott School to manage a possible event of this nature. The Ministry of Education has indicated there will be a nationwide review of these procedures which we will also be involved in Term 2. It will be timely for us to complete a lock down drill with the students, but this is something we will delay to a time that is more settled.

Today we farewelled our Year 5 and 6 students as they are off to Waikanae for their El Rancho Camp Adventure. I have no doubt this will be a major highlight for the year for all the children involved. The teachers from this team have worked incredibly hard over the past term to prepare an action packed trip for the students. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Melissa Coton and her team for putting in the extra hours of planning and taking on the extra responsibility for caring for the students this week. All these teachers are taking time away from their families to make this week happen, so for this we are all incredibly grateful!

It has been wonderful to see the quality artwork popping up around the school over the past couple of weeks. The classrooms especially, are looking alive with colour! If you haven't been into your child's classroom recently, make sure you find some time to check out the work on display!
