Ideas for Home Learning for Senior School Students

Writing

- Write a letter. This could be a chatty letter to say 'hello' a family member, friend, classmate or neighbour, it could be a letter to say 'thank you' to someone who has helped you or given you a gift, it could be a 'letter to the editor' or to a public figure about an issue you think is important.
- Make cards for friends and family members
- Make signs for around the house
- Make a poster about
- Make a word find and share it with your classmates
- Create a <u>crossword</u> and share it with your classmates
- Make a kahoot quiz and share it with your classmates
- Draw a cartoon
- Write alternative lyrics for your favourite song
- Write and film an advertisement for your favourite food
- Write a review of your favourite book and post it on Amazon
- Make a menu plan for your family. Write a shopping list of the ingredients you will need
- Come up with 10 interesting open-ended questions and interview a family member (you could ring a grandparent etc)
- Build a "fable fort" out of blankets and chairs. Camp in it while you create stories to tell your family over dinner.
- Create a Venn Diagram that compares and contrasts two people in your family, your neighbourhood, or your church, or other groups you belong to.
- Write and illustrate a picture book for your buddy class
- Write a recipe for a spell. Explain what the spell does.
- Create an itinerary for a dream holiday. Where will you stay? What will you do?
- Design a menu for a goblin / elf / giant / unicorn / monster family
- Create a 3D model (or make a drawing) of a mythical beast and write a description of its features, habitat and behaviour.
- Keep a journal of 5 interesting things about each day and 1 thing you are grateful for.
- Write a song you could use a tune of a well-known one and write new lyrics.
- Create a presentation about one of your heroes it could be someone famous or a family member
- Browse the <u>pobble365</u> website. Write to a photo.

Reading

- Read a book under a tree ask someone to take a photo of you and share it via Google Classroom
- Sign up for Epic Books remote student access (your teacher will send an invitation email to your parents) and explore what's available
- Challenge yourself to read a genre you have never read before
- Ring a grandparent and read them a story over the phone
- Read a story to your brother, sister, or pet
- Listen to your brother or sister read to you

- Listen to some of the amazing stories on the youtube channel: Story time from Space
- Read something interesting on https://wonderopolis.org/ can you make a Google Slide presentation about it?

Mathematics

- Measure the area and perimeter of each room in your house.
- Graph the types of birds that frequent your backyard or window
- Draw a map of your home.
- Measure the length of your bed using five different nonstandard units e.g blade of grass, length of your hand etc.
- Go for a run (the same route e.g. around the house twice, to the end of the street and back etc.) every day and time yourself graph your results over time.
- Graph the weather for a week, e.g., the daily temperature, rainfall, or wind speed
- Make a map of an imaginary place. Include a key, colour, and scale
- Practice your basic facts by clicking on the link https://maths.prototec.co.nz/

Learning Outside

- Plant spring bulbs in a container
- Plant winter crops in the veggie garden
- Weed the garden
- Collect leaves from ten different (non-harmful) plants. Sort them by size, colour, and texture.
- Sit silently outside for 15 minutes while you write down every sound you hear. When you are done, classify the sounds (high/low pitch, high/low volume, manmade v. naturally occurring, etc.).
- Take a photo a day and write a caption for each photo and why you chose it.

Art

- Log onto the youtube playlist: <u>Art class with Mo Willems</u> complete some of his classes and seesaw the results. You will need a sharpie or black felt for these.
- Make a model using: fimo, clay, lego, papier mache, origami, etc.
- Sketch a still life arrangement
- Draw a picture of your ideal bedroom

- Do a jigsaw and photograph the finished jigsaw
