

The Board had its first meeting at Alert level 1 around the table on Monday night – a real table! It was fantastic to be back in the same room and it was a very productive meeting.

We had a great presentation from Jodi Mitchell, Deputy Head and SENCO (Special

Educational Needs Coordinator), about Learning, Behaviour and Wellbeing support at Boulcott School. Jodi talked about the type of work she and the Teacher Aide team undertake to support a wide range of learning and behaviour needs for our students and also



their whānau. Thank you Jodi for bringing all the information together and adding to a long day by coming along to present it in person.

Property planning was another focus of the meeting. Late last year the Board completed a ten year property plan and it was approved by the Ministry of Education. The lockdown period has meant a delay in getting underway, but we have now started the early planning stages of very exciting property improvements. The Board would like to thank Natasha Khaw for her advice and assistance which has helped us navigate the Ministry of Education's property processes. Over the next 5 year period we will be upgrading some of the classrooms in the Middle and Senior school, making them flexible learning spaces and creating the opportunity for classes and teachers to collaborate more easily. However, much like the work undertaken in the Junior school in 2018, the plan is to keep the ability for classrooms to also work as a 'single unit' when appropriate. The first property work you will be able to see getting underway shortly will be some exterior re-painting and re-concreting to tidy up the outdoor area.

The last update we have for this newsletter is that a final outcome from the Environment Court process for the Summerset development continues to progress. Our last update to you was that resource consent has more or less been given to the development, with a few conditions that Summerset needed to respond to. As an affected party, Boulcott School had the opportunity to submit feedback on the draft consent conditions. We provided a submission with several key points including:

- Being given at least 48 hours notice of physical work commencing on site to ensure we can manage any school preparation and community communication.
- Confirmation of the site working hours as part of this we re-emphasised that school hours extend to encompass before and after school care services for our students.
- Concerns around how dust, noise and traffic reporting and monitoring will be handled.

• Finally, a request that Boulcott School have representation in any Community Liaison Group that is established.

At this stage the final Court decision is still pending this Draft Consent Conditions review. Once there is an outcome we will update the school community as soon as possible.
