



Kia ora koutou,

Well, it has certainly been a roller-coaster of a week hasn't it! The return to Level 2 restrictions means we are still not out of the woods yet. It was a relief to hear we were not moving to Level 3 last Friday... lets hope we can pull together again to stamp this nasty virus out of the community in Auckland.

A huge thank you for once again supporting the restrictions under Level 2. Our main focus is around minimising the amount of visitors we have on site, hence why we are asking you drop your child/ren at the school gate. If you do need to visit the school, please use the COVID-19 Tracer App to register your presence at school. You'll see these QR codes on most entries and classroom windows around the school. If your child is late please make sure they sign in at the office before going to class.

Our main goal at school over the past week has been keeping things as normal as possible for our tamariki, many of which we have observed a shift in anxiety levels, which is completely understandable. It is important to consider what messages the children are exposed to during this heightened time. Whether it be listening to media reports or simply over-hearing adult conversations, it is surprising what messages 'stick' in their minds. You might be interested in a couple of flyers that popped into my inbox last week, one referring to tips for parents and caregivers on media coverage of major events. The other is around coping with stress during infectious disease outbreaks. Both are well-worth the read.

I also thought I'd share this little message from a Principal colleague which I think sums up things nicely:

Please don't underestimate the toll that the COVID experience this year has had on us all. We all weathered this extraordinary experience over many months, staying positive, being kind and getting through. We have now been thrown back to Level 2, with the uncertainty of how this will play out over the coming days, weeks and months. We are 'COVID-weary'; outwardly putting on the energetic, brave face in front of our families, workmates and friends. Underneath we are weary, and a certain amount of anxiety is bubbling beneath the surface. Digging deep

is harder than it was. So again, be kind to yourself and be aware we are all feeling this in our own way. Humans are fragile and a little TLC goes a long way right now.

CALENDAR UPDATES

As you know, Level 2 restrictions have impacted on our event calendar. This will no doubt continue to change depending on the situation but here's what we know for now:



- TEACHER ONLY DAY is going ahead as planned this Friday,
 21 August. School is closed for students this Friday.
- INTERZONE CROSS COUNTRY has been rescheduled for Friday,
 28 August. This is great news for our top runners!
- HOME & SCHOOL DISCO at this stage is still on for Friday, 28 August. We will make a decision on this after the Government's review of level restrictions this Friday. There is an option to reschedule this event to Term 4 if we have to.
- INTERZONE SWIMMING is still on for Friday, 4 September.
- CELEBRATION OF ARTS EVENING is still on for Wednesday,
 23 September. Our first Electives session to prepare for this evening starts next week.

PROPERTY UPDATE

We are excited to see some contractors on-site to start a couple of minor concreting projects in the playground. If you do visit school, you'll notice safety fencing up under the shade sail where new concrete is going down, replacing the gravel under the picnic tables. They will then move to the area outside our caretaker's shed, replacing the existing broken concrete. We are excited to finally get this work underway!

SCHOOL RE-VISIONING CONSULTATION

Over the last 2 terms, the Boulcott staff and Board of Trustees have been reviewing our current school vision to see if it still fits with our future direction for the school. Last week, I had the pleasure of working with our Year 6 House Captains, to hear their views of our current vision and their ideas for the school's future. They certainly are a creative bunch! The next part of the process is getting feedback from you, the parents and caregivers, so keep an eye out for an online survey to complete in the next couple of weeks!

Kia ora e te whānau. The Board of Trustees held our first meeting for the term last week and there's certainly a lot going on around the school. The first key piece of news is that the Board approved a decision to opt into the Government donation scheme again for the 2021 school year. The roll numbers for this year are lower than last year, which will mean we unfortunately receive less Government funding, but the Board felt that now more than ever, with so much uncertainty, the opportunity to take financial pressure off the school community was the right decision.

The property plan that was approved in late 2019 is progressing. Following a tender process, we have appointed an Architect to modernise Rooms 1 - 4 in the Senior Syndicate and a couple of the Middle classrooms also. We're very excited to see some innovative ideas that will bring our learning spaces in line with modern teaching practices. We were particularly pleased to find an architect that recognised the special character of Boulcott School and will design in a way that complements our beautiful buildings and environment.

Stu Devenport was also able to share some exciting news with us at our meeting. The Senior Leadership Team has been successful in securing Ministry funding for 120 hours of professional development time to support a big push to raise achievement in writing across the school. Writing has been identified in the School Charter and Annual Plan as an area for improvement through all levels of the school. The Ministry funding will allow a literacy specialist to work with our teachers on the upcoming Teacher Only Day in August, and there will be further input from a second literacy specialist in early 2021, so there's some real opportunity to supercharge some great writing and lift achievement for our students.

Finally for this update, this term the Board will be reviewing the policies on Learning Support, Appointment Procedure and Child Protection. Links to these can be found on the school's website under the Information tab. Look for *Policy & Procedure: SchoolDocs*, follow the link to the SchoolDocs website and log in using Boulcott as the username and password. We welcome any feedback on the policies from the school community.
