

Boulcott School Celebration of Learning! Wednesday 23 September





Kia ora koutou e te Boulcott whanau,

Wow! It's hard to believe we are in the second to last week of Term 3! Interestingly, this is also the longest period of teaching and learning time without interruption for all of 2020!

We have had a very settled couple of weeks, with some wonderful learning happening around the school.

We are all looking forward to opening up the classrooms to share our learning with whanau next Wednesday for our Celebration of Learning. With the restrictions of Level 2 this term, this will be a welcomed opportunity for you to visit the classrooms. The children can't wait to showcase their learning with you.

So, what is the plan for next Wednesday afternoon:

- ❑ All the classrooms are open for whanau to visit from 3 to 6pm. Your child will have their learning to share with you and will take you for 'a tour' around the class. (Look out for an invitation coming your way soon!)
- □ Visual Art from our Art Electives will be on display through the main corridor and foyer.
- Performing Arts from Electives will be showcased on the classroom TVs.
- The annual Scholastic Book Fair will be operating in the School Library for you to purchase new books (keep a look out for your child's 'wishlist' coming home soon!).
- □ Home and School will be operating a bbq, selling yummy sausages for an afternoon/dinner treat.
- Our Senior students will be operating a bake sale for you to purchase more yummy treats, so make sure you bring along some cash.
- □ The Cottage will also be open, showcasing work from our Pumanawa learning groups.

Although there is a bit more certainty that we will be at Level 1 next Wednesday, we have made the cautious decision **to not go ahead** with the live performances in hall for this evening. It would simply be too challenging to manage the social distancing and gathering limit restrictions under Level 2. As an

alternative, we will be filming all the performing art items early next week and will package them together so you can view in the classrooms on Wednesday, or from the comfort of your own home, at a later date.

TE WIKI O TE REO MAORI

It's Maori Language Week this week! Our school plays an active role in revitalising the Māori language, and celebrating and promoting te reo Māori. Māori Language Week is an opportunity for concentrated celebration, promotion and encouragement.

We started the week on Monday taking part in the Maori Language Moment at 12pm, singing Tutira mai in the sunshine.

Did you know that Māori Language Week has been celebrated each year from 1975.



Māori Language Day is September 14 and commemorates the presentation of the 1972 Māori language petition to Parliament.

The chosen theme for 2020 is again 'Kia Kaha te Reo Māori'.

'Kia Kaha' is well understood in New Zealand English with its meaning of 'be strong'. We often talk about languages as if they are people – talking about language health, strength and revitalisation. So when we say 'Kia Kaha te Reo Māori' we're saying - 'Let's make the Māori language strong'.
