ASSEMBLY TERM 4

As you are aware Boulcott School is well on our way on our Positive Behaviour for Learning journey. We have decided to be creative and try something new - based on research and successes happening in other schools we work with in our network. As part of this initiative, we are going to trial a different approach to our **assemblies and House points system for Term 4**. The PB4L team will seek feedback from staff, kids and community at the end of Term 4 around this trial.

Our assemblies will be on even weeks (2, 4, 6, 8) on a **Monday morning** - starting just after the teachers have taken the roll and then walked their classes over to the hall. Families are welcome to attend after dropping their children off at school. The content will be similar to what we have currently. We will try to keep assemblies to around 40-45 minutes long. Please feel free to stay after drop off and enjoy our morning assemblies.

House Points will be announced in assembly as usual. The House Captains will then pour the contents of all four House point boxes into a see-through tube that will be on display in the office. This shows that when we all work together as a team at Boulcott School to earn Cheer House Points, we can earn a school-wide reward. Our first reward last term was 'bring a toy' day which the kids really enjoyed. Our School Council has interviewed kids and come up with a great list of fun, cheap/free fun whole school ideas for this term once the tube is full!!

One last trial involves the winning House each fortnight - as this usually just contributes to the cup at the end of the year. We are going to trial the winning House each fortnight having 10 minutes extra supervised play on the Monday the points are announced. Research shows that if rewards are frequent and as immediate as possible, positive behaviours are reinforced.

Please note in Weeks 9 and 10 our special 'End of Year Leavers' assembly and prize-giving celebration will be at usual times (to be advised closer to the time).


