Drop off and Pick up from School

We have noticed many children have been arriving at school after 9am on a regular basis. A reminder that the first bell of the school day is **8:55am**. We expect all children to be at school and ready for learning **before** this time so they are set for success for the busy day ahead. Arriving early means they have time to connect with their peers, play and get their equipment ready for learning. Arriving late often means children miss out on key messages from teachers, which can put them on the back foot for the rest of the day.

Please also ensure your child/ren are collected on time at the end of the day. It is simply not okay to have children waiting to be collected after 3:20pm. If you know you are going to be late collecting your children, we encourage you to utilise SKIDS for after school care in our school hall.

NOOD FOOD!

A few years ago, Boulcott introduced the Nood Food initiative. Now it's back, and ten times bigger than before. For those of you who don't know what Nood Food is, Nood Food is a waste free lunchbox system. This means no plastic packets, single-use packaging and plastic wrap.

But just because your favourite chippies come in plastic doesn't mean you can't pack them in your child's lunchbox. Simply remove the packaging at *home* and send your child to school with the chippie rubbish gone. With things such as chippies, crackers, yoghurt, custard and easily bruised or canned fruit, you can transfer them into a suitably sized multi-use container. This will make you have a clean and green school lunchbox approach.

But sometimes even that isn't possible. For people who are busy full time, just buy food without rubbish to begin with. Swap out your plastic container fruit-jelly for a can of fruit. And if even that's not possible, just try your best to reuse, reduce and recycle.

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
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
