





Kia ora koutou Boulcott whānau

Welcome to Term 2 2021! I hope you all enjoyed the break from school routines over the last couple of weeks. Wellington is definitely starting to feel quite autumnal, with chilly mornings changing colours - it's always a nice time of year!

CHEER TOKENS!

We have replaced the old House point cards with flash new CHEER tokens. Turquoise tokens are worth 10 House points and the coveted gold tokens are worth 50! These still go into House points boxes and totals are announced at assemblies. The winning House is celebrated and gets 10 minutes free supervised playtime that day. Points get added up over the year to go towards the House Cup.

All tokens are then poured into a transparent container in the office area. This is a visible way of seeing how many tokens we are earning as a whole school by working together to show our CHEER values. The School Council interviewed classes about rewards. When the container is full the whole school has their reward - for e.g. a pyjama and bring a game day.

ENROLMENTS BALLOT

Camp Makahika - 2021

At the end of Term 1 the Senior Syndicate went on a fantastic camp. For weeks the anticipation had been building and when we stepped onto the buses, everyone was excited.

As there were three different days and overnight places at camp, there were three groups of people as well. These were the yellow, blue and green groups, which all rotated through the different activities.

One of the most popular activities at camp was the Zipline. Everyone enjoyed whizzing down the line, striking poses all the way. Most people wanted to go again. Another favourite



activity was high ropes, where everyone loved to be scared by the terrifying heights of 14 metres. If you didn't enjoy the heights, you could always just climb the ladder or guard the harness of whoever was climbing at the time.

We learnt about bushcraft survival and one of these activities was fire lighting. We roasted marshmallows and learnt how to start a fire in the bush out of tinder and fuel.

We also went to a special area and built some bivouacs (a shelter in the middle of nowhere made out of tarp and big sticks). On cue the rain started pouring down. Luckily we all got in our shelters and were fine.

Another activity was the river crossing. We did a freezing cold walk through the water. It was so exhausting and your legs stung like crazy but it was great fun. Once the whole group got across the river and back again we got Freddo Frogs and had a hot shower. That possibly was the best bit of the day.

The bush walk was really long (like 5 hours). It was also very muddy. It passed through a private farm so there was a lot of cow poop. Good thing there was a stream and a huge rushing river. We walked up a steep incline, followed by more cow poop then down another steep incline into a National park. We did a huge loop track back up towards camp, then turned into the bush hut.

At camp, everyday we got delicious food. Even people from home made amazing baking for our morning teas. Most mornings we had cereal and toast for breakfast, except the morning at the Bush hut - we got sausages and eggs.

We had different meals every night. Burgers, Pasta-Bake and Roast chicken. We even got yummy apple crumble and ice cream. It was delicious.

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
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
