Kia ora Boulcott whānau,

We are officially midway through Term 4. This time next month we will be farewelling our Year 6 leavers as we conclude another exciting year at Boulcott School.

Thanks for your support with our Teacher Only Day on Monday. This was a timely 'non-contact' day for teachers to get stuck into writing end of year reports for each of their learners in their class. There is a lot of information that is pulled together to create these reports; from individual and class assessments, to classroom observations. I know all the teachers thoroughly appreciate the quiet time to make a solid start on this process.

This week also marks a key date for the Covid-19 vaccination mandate for all education workers across the country. I'm pleased to let you know that as of this week 100% of the Boulcott staff have been vaccinated.

As reported in the last newsletter, this mandate also applies to other adults that come on site while our tamariki are here. The general rule for this is if you are on site, working in a role that is either paid or unpaid, you are required to be vaccinated. This does include if you are a parent who is volunteering in a role (eg Home and School help, classroom help, school trip helper, sports coach etc). If this applies to you, you would have received a short survey to complete so we can gather this information. This information is kept confidential at school. A huge thank you to everyone who has provided us with these details already.

You are NOT required to be vaccinated if you are onsite 'as a parent'. This includes dropping/collecting your children, settling them into class or attending parent/teacher meetings.

As we continue to operate in a Level 2 environment, we are preparing for what our end of year celebrations will look like with restrictions still in place. Many of you will be familiar with how things traditionally look at this time of year, with many events that are open for parents and caregivers to attend.

With current restrictions still in play, the end of year events may look very different this year. It is our priority to still host our annual Prize Giving, our Year 6 Leavers Evening and our final school assembly, but there may be a strong possibility that whānau will be unable to attend. We are currently exploring options to film these events so parents can still be involved, but sadly from a distance. We hope to confirm these arrangements with you in the next few weeks.





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
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
