Kia ora koutou Boulcott Whānau,

It has been a very special week at Boulcott. On Monday we gathered our Senior students to officially open our new and improved Kahikatea Learning Space. A special thank you to Whaea Pania for supporting us with our blessing - we even had a little pīwakawaka join us outside while we sang! The new spaces look amazing. They are bright, open and flexible to meet the needs of how our tamariki learn. This project has been several years in the making and took over 6 months to complete. Over the past couple of days we have shifted Room 1 and 2 into their new spaces, which means we can reclaim our school library and our New Entrant students can spread out across Room 7 and 8. The builders have a couple more jobs to complete in Rooms 3 and 4 and we are hoping we will have all our Senior classes in their new spaces by the end of the term - yay!

As mentioned in the last newsletter, our next property project has officially begun. The work will address several of the weather tightness issues we have experienced in the hall, main corridor and Junior classrooms over the past 10 years. This is a significant project and will take over 8 months to complete. The first phase of the project involves work on the main entrance and road face of the school hall. This means our hall can still be used but we have restricted space. It also means the main entrance to the school and hall will be off limits for at least two months, so we will be setting up alternative access points for the Office and SKIDS (Before and After School Care). Fortunately, we have gained another access point back due to the Senior School work being completed. Please check out the map below to see how you can access these spaces.

This work will cause some disruption to our daily operations but it is something that we have been preparing for many years. The sooner the builders start, the sooner we can get the school back to normal and leak free!



COVID 19 UPDATE

We have continued to see a reduction of positive cases in students over the past couple of weeks and our overall attendance rates have continued to improve. It has also been pleasing to see most of our staff return from isolation. We are still being notified about positive cases, who have recently attended school, so it is important to stay vigilant for symptoms in your child and keep them at home if they are unwell. We do have a small supply of RAT tests at school if your family requires them.

With the recent changes to the traffic light system, we now longer require staff and parent volunteers to be vaccinated while working with children. We really appreciate your support with following these requirements for the short time they were in place.

A reminder that we are still operating in the RED Traffic Light for our Covid prevention so visitors are still

restricted on site as much as possible. We will be watching the Government announcement next week with interest, to see what changes we can make for the start of Term 2.

It was wonderful to finish March on a high with special wheels days for each Syndicate last week. Having a shared understanding about how we cater for these needs across and within schools means we could have a more targeted approach when providing support. Having learners at the centre of education and creating a barrier-free environment are key themes of Boulcott School's strategic initiative and also a Government priority.

During my absence Boulcott School will be in very safe hands. Our Deputy Principal, Jodi Mitchell, will be taking on the Acting Principal role, while Jo Lock will be released from the classroom for additional support. Jo will continue to teach in Room 16 part time, while Suz Cody picks up additional days when Jo is on management release.
