#### TRIP TO THE DOWSE!

Over the last two weeks all of the classes at school have gone on a trip to the Dowse Art Gallery in Lower Hutt.

The first exhibition we went to was called 'Chromaflag'. Chromaflag is a room with bright orange walls on each side. Also, there were different splashes of colours on the walls like green, blue, sky blue and 13 other colours! Some of the splashes were made out of clay. We got to feel the clay. It was nice and smooth.

Next we went to a place called 'My River Goes With Me'. It was a quiet black room with 4 screens on each wall. There was a mountain with a river at the bottom of it. The other 3 screens had trees with a

river in the background. You could hear tweets in the backround, also you could hear the river flowing. There were some pebbles in the middle with a pattern flowing on it. You could see birds popping up in the trees and vanishing and there was also a fox doing the same thing.

We went through a door and into a brownish room with Nuku Tewhatewha, a pātaka in the middle. The pātaka was made over 160 years ago. It used to hold resources and it was about half a metre above the ground so pests can't get into it. The people who worked at the Dowse said it will never leave the Dowse.

Then we went upstairs and went into the amazing CREATIVE ROOM! We got an art apron and sat down at a desk. We printed patterns on paper to represent a river. Then we used clay to make something that lives next to a river. I made a human but someone else made a cute little duck.

We had a fantastic time at the Dowse!
