






Kia ora koutou Boulcott Whānau,



As we move into the second half of the term, our Kahikatea team are ramping up their preparation for performing at HuttFest in Week 10. Our kura's performance may look quite different from previous years without Matua Whaitiri supporting us this year, but this does provide some of our kaiako an opportunity to utilise their expertise in performance. At our last Board of Trustees meeting Jo Lock, our Associate Principal, shared our latest student achievement data across the 3 core subjects of Reading, Writing and Maths. In the middle of the year we report on the overall teacher judgement which is based on in-class assessment, student work and classroom observations. Below is a snapshot of the judgements from across the school.







It is very pleasing to see the excellent results across all 3 curriculum areas, with approximately 90% of students achieving at or above expectation in the 3 areas. This reflects the excellent teaching that takes place at Boulcott and most importantly - the hard mahi our tamariki do at school each and every day... Ka rawe! Keep up the excellent work everyone!

PROPERTY UPDATE

The team from Peryer Construction are continuing to make steady progress with our weather tightness project of our main block. They are close to completion of Stage 2, which focuses on areas in the western end of the block. We are hoping we will regain access to our Hall, Junior corridor and Rooms 9 and 10 soon. The next stage of construction will be concentrated around our main entrance and

administration area. We are currently working with Peryer on how this will look as it will likely involve office staff being temporarily relocated. We will keep you posted once we have confirmed the details!



As you know, our parent community is currently deciding who will become our Boulcott Board of Trustees for the next three years. This means the previous Board meeting was the final meeting for our existing Board members. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank our out-going Board members for their hard work and unwavering support over the past 3 years. I have appreciated you sharing your expertise and keeping our Boulcott tamariki at the heart of all decision making.

WHĀNAU RŌPU



Hutt Science Competition

Recently, some students took part in the Hutt Science Competition which is a STEMM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics, and Medicine) quiz for kids in Years 5 - 8.

This opportunity was kindly organised for Boulcott to compete by Mrs Olds.

The quiz had four rounds which all had ten questions each. In between each round was a practical challenge that teams had to complete. An example from this year's quiz was that they gave the teams twelve gummy lollies and twelve skewers. With that material



we had to make a building. We would get one point if the structure stood, two points if it could support a tennis ball, and three points if it could support a rugby ball.

The highest Boulcott scored in the quiz was 3rd place - teno pai!

At the end there was a tie, so there was a tie-breaker where the two teams had to guess how many tonnes the Statue of Liberty was. The tied teams guessed 41 and about 7 tonnes. The statue itself is about 204 metric tonnes (not including the plinth). Our team had a guess for fun (we guessed 50) and this was closer than either of the two tied teams!

The quiz was pretty cool, all thanks to Mrs Olds and all the other parents that helped out!

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
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
