There have been big celebrations in the Kahikatea Team over the last couple of days on hearing how well our two Tournament of Minds teams went at Victoria University on Saturday. A huge congratulations to Riley, Bach, Klara, Jasmin, Melody and Addi who WON the Year 5 and 6 Arts Category. This means they have been selected to attend the National Competition at Victoria University on Saturday, 17 September. Great work also to Anna, Kelsey, Wai, Tala, Lucas, Thomas and Ruby who achieved HONOURS in their Year 5 and 6 Literature section. Last week we also had two Year 5 and 6 teams compete in the annual Mathswell Mathematics Competition at Wellington College. There was some stiff competition but both teams participated well, placing 7th and 11th out of MANY other teams.

Last Friday, over 11 students from Years 4 to 6 attended Huia Pool for time trials for selection in the upcoming InterZone Swimming Competition.

Yesterday, many children from Kahikatea were out and about again! Firstly, we had a large group of children competing in the Inter-school Futsal competition at Walter Nash Stadium. We also had a smaller group that travelled into Wellington to compete in the children's Lit Quiz... they also had a bonus of playing in the snow in Karori in between rounds!!

How wonderful it is to see the calendar full once again of events and opportunities like the above for students to take part. It is something we have all missed considerably during Covid restrictions. Another highlight of last week was our Onesie Day where we raised funds for Wellington Free Ambulance. STAFFING UPDATE

At the beginning of the year you may recall I shared that Jo Lock, our Associate Principal, will be away from school in Term 4 on Teacher Sabbatical. This is a valuable opportunity for Jo to complete some educational study. Her focus area is investigating the benefits of real-time student reporting, so this time will allow her to visit other schools and learn how they utilise different platforms to share student achievement with whānau.

While Jo is away from Boulcott School, Suz Cody will be teaching in Room 16 full time. This works well as Suz is already familiar with Room 16 as she already teaches in this space every Friday.

With my departure at the end of Term 3 and Jo away in Term 4, our Senior Leadership Team will be temporarily re-structured until the Board of Trustees finds a permanent replacement for my Principal role. Finally, it is with great sadness that I announce that Ruth Olds will be leaving Boulcott School at the end of the school year. Ruth has been a valuable member of the Boulcott staff for over 10 years and has had a variety of roles including classroom teaching across Years 3 to 6, release teacher, Punamawa Teacher and most recently our Sports Coordinator. Ruth and her family will be moving to the sunny Wairarapa in 2023, and will all be greatly missed by our Boulcott community!

PROPERTY UPDATE

We have more details about the next stage of work with our weather-tightness project of the hall and main block. As mentioned in the last newsletter, the next stage involves work in and above our administration area, main entrance and foyer. Below are the important details you need to know on accessing the school buildings:

- From this Friday, 9 September there will be no access to the main entrance to the school and hall. The main gate can be used, but to access the school office you need to use the deck access in Kahikatea Area.
- From Monday, 19 September our school office will be temporarily relocated to 'The Cottage' which is the old dental clinic by the pedestrian crossing. If you are visiting the school, it is important you sign in at 'The Cottage' before you enter the other buildings.
- We are also hoping that Room 10 will be able to relocate to their permanent classroom in Room 10 on Monday, 19 September.

• It is also likely we will be able to regain access to the school hall from September 19, which means we can finally host whole school assemblies and SKIDS can return to location for before and after school care.

Like all building projects, there is likely to be changes to the timeline so we will keep you updated over the next couple of weeks so you are aware of what is happening.


