
Around the Classes

Student Achievement

In preparation for this week's Board meeting I have had a close study of the students' 2022 Achievement data. I am really impressed with how Boulcott School children have achieved academically over the last 12 months, despite COVID disruptions having hung over us all.



In this graph you can see that our achievement levels are at 93% in Reading. This means that across the school 93% of our current learners are currently achieving 'at' or 'above' expected curriculum levels. In writing that level is at 89% and in Mathematics 88%. A few years ago the government set a target for all schools to reach 85% of students achieving at or above curriculum levels - so as you can see, Boulcott learners are already exceeding that target. It is pleasing to see Boulcott School students are continuing to achieve well over time and benefit from programmes that offer extra support for our priority learners. This year we will continue to monitor our students' progress and as a staff we will continue to reflect on our practice and grow our teaching capabilities and knowledge, so that our tamariki continue to flourish.

Teacher Only Day

In this spirit, we have a Teacher Only Day planned for the **first day of Term 2 - Monday, 24 April.** The following day is ANZAC day - a public holiday. I thought by letting you know now it would make arrangements for child care a little easier and that some of you may be able to make plans to have an extra long weekend away. The Teacher Only day will provide our staff with dedicated time to understand, prepare for, and engage with changes across The NZC refresh, the redesign of *Te Marautanga o Aotearoa (The NZ curriculum)*. This professional development day is mandatory for all New Zealand schools and the dates were identified on the advice of the Education sector advisory group.

An AED (automated external defibrillator) has recently been donated to Boulcott School. We would like to thank the charities "Embracing Hearts" and "The Pelorus Trust" for fully funding the cost of the AED (\$3214.25) and the lock box (\$1058).

We would also like to say a massive thank you to Wellington Free Ambulance for supplying the AED, installing it and providing ongoing maintenance for the device.

The AED is located at the front of the school by the CHEER values pencils.

It is in a 24/7 alarmed lock box that is accessible to the entire community in the event of an emergency.


