Welcome back to Term 2. I trust you all had a refreshing break and managed to have some special family time together. I had a great holiday spending two wonderful weeks exploring Wellington! One day, my husband and I cycled around the waterfront to Miramar, then across to Seatoun and around to Scorching Bay for lunch and then back

to the city. We also (on a separate day) caught the ferry from town over to Days Bay and then cycled to the Pencarrow Lighthouse. Now, before you get too impressed, I do have to admit we were on e-bikes, but what a great way to explore your beautiful city. We also enjoyed a step back in time - visiting the Wellington museum - if you haven't been before it is a great place to visit with the kids and more importantly - it's free!

So I have arrived back for Term Two, recharged and energised ready for a busy and exciting term.

What's happening in Term 2 at Boulcott?

We have our **Cross-country and Colour Fun Run** day coming up in the next couple of weeks (**Monday, 15 May with Friday, 19 May** postponement day). Classes have of course already started training. More information will come out about this very soon.

HuttFest 2023 - a Māori and Polynesian performance festival for Primary and Secondary schools in the Hutt Valley and beyond. The theme is *Our Identity, Our Stage, Our Future* and our Senior students and their teachers are working really hard on their performances on the last week of this term.

Lunchtime clubs will also begin very soon, with the initial offerings being a Construction Club, a Colouring/Drawing Club, and a lunchtime Indoor Sports Club (badminton, table tennis etc..). This will keep many of our tamariki entertained at lunchtime, especially when it is wet outside. You will also shortly hear more details about an upcoming **Book Week** and an opportunity for older children who would like to participate in fundraising for the **40 Hour Famine**.

This term we are trialling a change with our **whole school assemblies**. We are looking to have these on Wednesday afternoons (odd weeks) from 2:20 - 2:50pm. Each class will take a turn hosting assembly and we begin with our youngest students from Room 8 running our assembly next **Wednesday**, **10 May**. CHEER awards will still be handed out and of course, parents are always welcome to attend.

Our teachers have planned some exciting **learning** for students this term.

Last week's Teacher Only Day saw us as a staff, learning about the changes coming up in our **NZ Curriculum**. We are excited to be looking at a brand new curriculum area " **Aotearoa NZ Histories**". Later in the year your children will be able to talk to you about what they are learning in this area.

Road Safety - There are lots of ongoing road works and building developments, which are making the roads around our school really busy. We ask you as parents to take care, especially on Ariki and Boulcott Streets. We had a situation last week where a child from our school was



Significant changes to the WINZ OSCAR Subsidy have been implemented since the beginning of April. This has resulted in a greater number of families now qualifying for subsidised care, making sKids more affordable. This is the breakdown of families that are now eligible for subsidised care:

- Families with 1 child earn a maximum of \$111,000 p.a.
- 2 children earn a maximum of \$127,000 p.a.
- 3 or more children earn a maximum of \$143,000 p.a.

To assist families, we have provided information on our website about the OSCAR Subsidy, including a simple calculator to help determine eligibility.
