Boulcott School operates a cohort entry policy. Cohort entry means New Entrants start school in groups at the start of each term or at a mid-term date set by the Ministry of Education, rather than on the day or week of their fifth birthday.

Research shows that sharing the experience of starting school with others can reduce anxiety, support emotional wellbeing and help with developing new friendships for our youngest tamariki. It also has a positive impact on connecting new parents with each other. Using scheduled entry points throughout the year, teachers can plan intentional learning experiences to support transition, while also minimising the disruption to existing students' classroom programmes. With our new cohort entry policy in place this year we welcomed 9 new students and their families into the Boulcott School community last week. They are all in either Room 8 with Mrs Anstiss or Room 9 with Mrs Clements.



At each fortnightly assembly 28 students (2 per class) are awarded CHEER certificates by their classroom teachers which recognise their demonstration of the CHEER values. Four of these students get drawn out of a hat to have a fish and chip lunch with me!!

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A word of warning.... To help all of our students who have additional learning and behaviour needs, we have appointed a new Teacher Aide, Sabrina Dephine. Sabrina is an experienced Teacher Aide with a background in Autism. She will start with us at the beginning of Term 2.

Strategic Plan - following feedback from our community, our Board has developed our Strategic Plan for the next three years. It details our vision and direction for Boulcott School. We have shared this with the Ministry and it can also be found on our school website.

CHANGE TO MORNING DROP OFF TIME IN TERM 2

Beginning in Term 2 2024, the time students can be dropped off at Boulcott School in the morning will change from 8:15am to 8:30am. This will bring our kura in line with our neighbouring primary schools' drop off times.

It will also reduce the time students are waiting for school to begin. We recognise that the change in routine will be a challenge for some of our families. Out of school care ([sKids](#)) operates in the school hall each morning from 7am until 8:30am.

Bullrush with Mr. Dentice

Once a week on a Thursday, Mr. D runs Bullrush for Kahikatea students only. Mr.D makes sure the play is fair and not too rough. The tackling rule is you have to tackle around the waist.

Bullrush is a game when there is one person who is in the centre, who calls a person to tackle. Then, if the person who is running calls "bullrush" everyone has to run. If you are on the ground, you're in with the person who starts. You **MUST** wear a mouthguard for

health and safety, so you don't get a concussion.

How to mould a mouthguard: first boil some water, then put your mouthguard in the boiling water with a spoon. Let it cool down, then put it on your teeth and bite down until it moulds into your teeth, and there are teeth marks on your mouth guard. Then rinse it under cold water for 30 seconds. If you already have a mouthguard then you're good to go.


