Term 4 is shaping up to be the busiest and arguably the most fun term of the year.





Attendance





These graphs provide a snapshot of how our school is performing with our attendance. It includes an overview of the reasons for absence broken

down by justified and unjustified reasons.

A 'Justified Absence' is an absence defined within a school's policy as an acceptable reason for a student to be away from school.

An 'Unjustified Absence' is recorded when a student is away from school and:

- There is no information or there is a throw-away excuse
- Explained but not within school policy, such as absence due to birthdays
- Absence due to holiday in term-time
- Extracurricular activities not organised by schools like sports, dance, music, or hobbies.

In April 2024, the Government announced a regular attendance target of 80 percent of students to be present for more than 90% of the term by 2030.

Key messages:

- 1. Regular attendance at school helps build and maintain a child's learning and positive daily habits and routines, as well as promoting their wellbeing by connecting them to their peers and learning new things.
- 2. We want our **ā**konga to thrive and be resilient and active members within their wh**ā**nau and community.
- 3. Attendance matters and we can all work together to increase school attendance.

Student Behaviour

At Boulcott School, we aim for all our tamariki to show the CHEER values at all times as they learn in their classrooms and interact with each other in the playground. We use the Positive Behaviour for Learning programme, adapted to our context, to teach tamariki about the behaviour that is expected at our kura for everyone to be able to learn and flourish.

We utilise our student management system (currently eTAP) to record incidences where the CHEER values are not shown. When an incident is recorded by a duty teacher at break time or a teacher during learning time, a notification is sent to the class teacher of the child as well as their team leader and the Deputy Principals.

In Term 4, if a student receives two or more entries in a week, or five or more in the term for similar types of behaviour, they will have a check-in meeting with their team leader.

At this meeting the team leader will talk with the child about the things that have been recorded and support them to complete a behaviour reflection sheet and set some goals around their behaviour.

Following this, the team leader will email the whānau of the student to let them know about the recent behaviour issues, the meeting and reflection sheet coming home. The reflection sheet will be sent home with the student that day to be signed by a parent/caregiver and then to be returned to their class teacher the following week.

At the end of the year we will review this process to see if it is having an impact on reducing undesirable behaviour and increasing positive behaviour.



Measles Outbreak in NZ

Measles cases in Aotearoa

As you may be aware there have been recent measles cases linked to overseas travel reported in Te Tai Tokerau and Queenstown. Cases were active in the community while infectious and there is a risk of measles circulating there, and more widely in Aotearoa.

- Measles is very contagious and can make people of any age very sick.
- Watch for measles symptoms fever, cough, runny nose, sore eyes and a blotchy rash.

Measles: Locations of interest in Aotearoa New Zealand – Health New Zealand

- If anyone in your whānau has measles symptoms keep them home and contact a doctor or Healthline urgently on 0800 611 116.
- Vaccination is the best protection from measles. Check all whānau are immunised.

<u>Measles immunity – Health New Zealand</u> <u>Measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine – Health New Zealand</u>

• Anyone closely exposed to measles who has not received two MMR vaccinations cannot attend their school/kura for at least eight days.

World of Waste Tour

Last term the Kahikatea Syndicate went on a trip to learn more about what we've been studying – all the horrible waste people are creating! In the morning we met Chloe, who came to Boulcott School to take us on the World of Waste tour. She talked to us about all the rubbish we create and the materials we use, like glass. She explained how people often just throw things away instead of recycling them like they should.

After that, we went to a landfill to see what happens to the rubbish. There were different areas for different types of waste, but most of it just gets buried underground where it can sit for over 500 years before breaking down.

Next, we visited the Earthlink workshop. There we saw people repurposing rubbish like metal, wood, and hard plastics. They turned these into cool things, like a skateboard chair and other creative items.

Our last stop was The Dowse, where we made art using black ink, coloured paper, and stencils that we designed and cut out ourselves. Some classes also got a photo taken.

When we got back to school, around 2pm, we talked about what we had learned. Even though we were tired, we still had time to do some more learning about waste and how we can minimise it.

All students who live within the home zone <u>described below</u> and/or <u>shown on the</u> attached map shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

From the intersection of State Highway 2 and the Melling Bridge, the boundary is delling Link to High Street, numbers 403 to 751 inclusive (odd side) and 412 to 73nclusive (even side) are in zone.

From the intersection of High Street and Brunswick Street, the boundary is Brunswick Street, bith sicks, to Kings Crescent Kings Crescent numbers 119 (cold side) and 140 (even side) and above are in zone. Amberley Grove addresses are not in zone. From the intersection of Kings Crescent and Copeland Street, the boundary is Copaland Street both sides to Oxford Terrano. Oxford Terrano numbers 100 to 135 including. To the intersection with Brises Street are no zero.

From the intersection of Colorial Tetrade and Bleese Street the boundary is the centre in ord Brees Street (even numbered side in a zone, old numbered side on it is zone to Michael Street, Mitchell Street addresses (both sides) are in zone. The boundary is believed to the street of the street of


