#### Classes 2026

Our Leadership Team has begun our planning for 2026. One of the key planning components is looking at our student numbers, so we have a good understanding of how many children we will have in each learning team. If your circumstances are changing and you know your child/ren will not be returning to Boulcott School in 2026 can you please contact the school office: info@boulcott.school.nz

For 2026 our school organisation is looking like the following:

Kahikatea- 4 x Year 5/6 composite classes 1 x Year 4/5 composite class

Kōwhai- 4 x Year 3 / 4 composite classes

Harakeke- 2 x Year 2 classes, 1 x Year 1 /2 composite class, 2 x Year 1 classes with another 2 x New Entrants classes expected to open in Terms 2 and 3 respectively.

#### **Understanding Composite Classes (Multi-Level Groups)**

At Boulcott School, like many schools in New Zealand we have composite classes. These are classes that contain students from two different year levels—for example, a Year 3/4 class. These are commonly known as composite or multi-level classes, and they are a normal, intentional part of how we structure our learning environment.

#### Why Does Boulcott School Have Composite Classes?

The decision to form these groups is fundamentally a logistical necessity (the "numbers game") driven by the total number of students enrolled and the maximum class sizes set by the Ministry of Education.

- If we have 49 Year 2 students dividing them evenly across three single-level classes (e.g., three classes of 16) would result in numbers that are too low. Instead we could have two Year 2 classes with 24 and 25 students in them but these numbers are too high for this year level.
- Instead, we create three balanced classes— two x Year 2 classes and one x Year 1 and 2 composite class . This ensures equitable workloads for teachers and provides optimal student-to-teacher ratios across the entire school.

#### Why Parents Should Not Be Concerned

We understand that parents sometimes worry their child will be disadvantaged by being the younger or older student in the group. However, in modern teaching practice, this is not a concern, and often, the opposite is true:

- 1. Learning is Individualised, not strictly year-level based: Our teachers plan and teach to where your child is currently learning, not strictly to their age. Every classroom at Boulcott, regardless of its composition, has a range of abilities. In a composite class, learning is naturally differentiated, meaning the teacher designs tasks and content to meet the specific needs of individuals or small groups, rather than teaching one lesson to a single year group.
- 2. Leadership and Mentoring: Younger students benefit from the role-modelling and motivation provided by their older classmates, often progressing faster than they would in a single-age class. Conversely, older students gain invaluable leadership, communication, and consolidation skills by teaching or explaining concepts to their younger peers.
- 3. Social and Emotional Growth: Composite classes help students build stronger friendships and relationships across age groups. They foster a sense of whānau and cooperation, teaching adaptability and empathy that reflects the real world outside of school.

Composite classes are simply an effective structure that allows us to manage our school roll while upholding our core commitment to providing high-quality, differentiated teaching for every child.

Teaching teams have started the process of forming classes for 2026. This is a complex process where a lot of factors are taken into consideration. Learning, social, behaviour and emotional needs, are all put into the mix to ensure we make the right decisions for each child. At Boulcott School we do not take parent requests for class placements nor requests for specific teachers, however if you have some information you think we would find useful about your child, you are welcome to provide us with this. 



## Measles Outbreak in NZ

#### Measles cases in Aotearoa

As you may be aware there have been recent measles cases in areas of the North Island. Cases were active in the community while infectious and there is a risk of measles circulating more widely in Aotearoa.

- Measles is very contagious and can make people of any age very sick.
- Watch for measles symptoms fever, cough, runny nose, sore eyes and a blotchy rash.

#### Measles: Locations of interest in Aotearoa New Zealand – Health New Zealand

- If anyone in your whānau has measles symptoms keep them home and contact a doctor or Healthline urgently on 0800 611 116.
- Vaccination is the best protection from measles. Check all whānau are immunised.

<u>Measles immunity – Health New Zealand</u> <u>Measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine – Health New Zealand</u>

• Anyone closely exposed to measles who has not received two MMR vaccinations cannot attend their school/kura for at least eight days.
