## Principal's Message

Kia ora Boulcott Community,

I hope this newsletter finds you all well and looking forward to the holidays! As we race toward the end of the year, I want to share some incredibly positive news and celebrate the recent achievements of our amazing tamariki.

#### The Power of the Boulcott Community

I want to begin by offering a heartfelt thank you for the extraordinary support and understanding you showed during the recent unexpected closure related to the coloured sand recall. The speed and grace with which you responded to our urgent requests for child collection were nothing short of exceptional. It reaffirmed what a strong, supportive, and flexible community we have.

I am delighted to officially confirm that following a full assessment and testing by independent specialists, we have been given the **ALL CLEAR** to resume normal operations. We worked closely with the Ministry of Education and WorkSafe NZ, and the results confirmed that air quality throughout the school is safe and that contamination did not spread to any soft furnishings. We took swift, precautionary action, and we can now move forward with full confidence in the safety of our kura. Thank you again for your patience as we prioritised this critical safety issue.

#### **Celebrating Athletics Success!**

Over the last two weeks, our students demonstrated just how talented and spirited they are at both the **Central Zone Athletics and InterZone Athletics** competitions. The results were outstanding!

We had a massive team of **45 students** entered in Central Zone, and an incredible **35 students** then qualified to move through to the InterZones—what an achievement!

All our athletes were truly excellent ambassadors for Boulcott School. It was wonderful to see their enthusiasm and skill in running, jumping, and throwing, often battling through wind, rain, and sun. Beyond the physical achievements, their **strong sportsmanship**—encouraging both their peers and students from other schools—made us all immensely proud.



From the intersection of Oxford Terrace and Brees Street the boundary is the centre line of Brees Street (even numbered side is in zone, odd numbered side not in zone), to kitchell Street. Mitchell Street addresses (both sides) are in zone. The boundary crosses High Street at numbers 734 (even side) and 761 (odd side) as being in zone

The Golf Course/Reserve is the boundary, across the Hutt River and SH2 to include addresses on the Western Hills. The boundary is such that Pomare Road addresses and and Matuhi Street addresses are in zone. Tirohanga Road addresses 137 (odd side) and 141 (even addresses are in zone. Exhem Gorve addresses are all in zone. Valent Corve addresses are all in zone. Walter Road addresses and lin zone. Walter Road addresses and In zone.

From the intersection of Tirohanga Road and SH2, the zone boundary is SH2 south to its intersection with the Melling Bridge (the starting point).
