Just so invigorating! Although I have to admit, that whilst I did do a good few laps around the school bike track at our opening on a pedal powered bike, my own bike is an electric one, which

certainly helps around the steep hills of Mt Victoria. Speaking of the school bike track...

Grand Opening of Our New Bike Track!

What a spectacular afternoon we had for the official opening of the Boulcott School bike track! We were honoured to welcome the **Hon Chris Bishop**, who joined us to cut the ribbon and celebrate this incredible new asset for our school and community. The atmosphere was electric as we also officially welcomed our fleet of **Bikes in Schools**, which will ensure every student has the opportunity to develop their riding skills and confidence.

The highlight of the ceremony was seeing the pure enthusiasm on our students' faces as the first group took to the track. A special congratulations to the students from the **Kahikatea** and **Kowhai** teams, along with our newly appointed **Bike Monitors**, who were selected to lead the way and enjoy the very first ride on our brand new bikes. It was wonderful to see our CHEER values in action as the kids cheered each other on, marking the beginning of a new era of fitness, fun, and adventure at Boulcott School. A huge thank you to everyone who worked behind the scenes to make this dream a reality—we can't wait to see the track in full use every day!

Keeping Our Tamariki Safe: Important Traffic Safety Reminders

As you know, the safety of our students is our absolute priority. With the increase in activity around the school gates each morning and afternoon, I want to take a moment to share some vital reminders to ensure every child gets to and from school safely.

1. Buckle Up Every Time - While on duty at the pedestrian crossing, I have frequently noticed young children in the back seats of cars not wearing seatbelts, and small children travelling without the required booster seats. Even for the shortest trip down the road, please ensure your child is securely buckled in. It is not only the law, but it is the single most important thing you can do to protect them in the event of a sudden stop.

Key NZ Booster Seat Rules & Best Practice:

- **Legal Requirement:** Children must use an approved child restraint until their 7th birthday.
- **Aged 7 to 14:** If a booster seat or child restraint is available in the vehicle, it must be used. If not, a seatbelt must be used.
- **Best Practice (Height):** Experts recommend using a booster seat until the child is 148 cm tall.
- **Safety Position:** The back seat is the safest place; children under 15 should sit in the back if possible.
- **Fitting:** The seatbelt must fit correctly: the shoulder belt sits on the shoulder (not neck) and the lap belt sits low across the hips.

2. Watch Your Speed A reminder that the speed limit around our school and the surrounding streets is 30km/h. Keeping your speed down gives you more time to react to the unexpected movements of young children. Let's keep our streets slow and safe.

3. Use the Pedestrian Crossing - We teach our students to use the pedestrian crossing because it is the safest place to cross. Parents, please support us by:

- **Always using the crossing yourselves** when with your children (lead by example!).
- **Never calling your child to cross the road** directly to your car from across the street.
- **Avoid dropping children off** in areas that force them to dodge traffic to get to the school side.

4. Parking and Congestion - To keep visibility high and traffic flowing:

- **No Double Parking:** This creates dangerous "blind spots" for children trying to cross and

blocks other road users.

- **No Parking Over Driveways:** Please be respectful of our neighbours by ensuring their access is never blocked.
- **Yellow Lines:** These are there for a reason—parking on them, even for a "quick drop-off," significantly reduces visibility for our road patrol team and oncoming drivers.

We all want our children to arrive at school happy and safe. Thank you for your patience, your careful driving, and for putting the safety of our Boulcott community first.

A visit from the Hurricanes!

Our ballot closing date for enrolments for Term 3 & 4 closes on Monday, 25 May and will be drawn on Friday, 29 May.

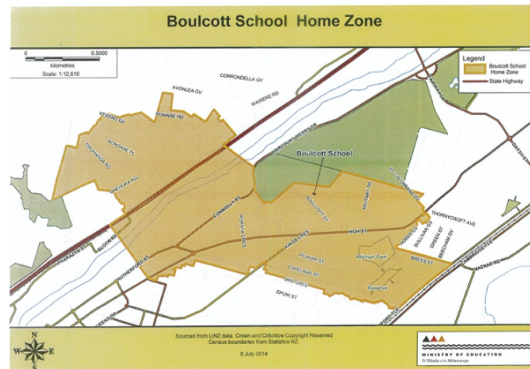
If you have a child turning 5 in 2026 we welcome you to complete an online enrolment form. This is important if you have a child who lives in zone and is turning 5 this year, as it helps us forecast our numbers throughout the year.

Please go to our website www.boulcott.school.nz and complete an enrolment form. This can be found by clicking on the 'Information Tab' and select 'enrolling at Boulcott School', scroll down to the bottom of the page to find the enrolment form.

Please see the zoning map below if you are unsure if you live in our school zone or out of zone.

All students who live within the home zone described below and/or shown on the attached map shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

From the intersection of State Highway 2 and the Melling Bridge, the boundary is Melling Link to High Street, numbers 403 to 761 inclusive (odd side) and 412 to 734 inclusive (even side) are in zone.

From the intersection of High Street and Brunswick Street, the boundary is Brunswick Street, both sides, to Kings Crescent. Kings Crescent numbers 119 (odd side) and 140 (even side) and above are in zone. Amberley Grove addresses are not in zone.

From the intersection of Kings Crescent and Copeland Street, the boundary is Copeland Street, both sides, to Oxford Terrace. Oxford Terrace numbers 100 to 135 inclusive, to the intersection with Brees Street are in zone.

From the intersection of Oxford Terrace and Brees Street the boundary is the centre line of Brees Street (even numbered side is in zone, odd numbered side not in zone), to Mitchell Street. Mitchell Street addresses (both sides) are in zone. The boundary crosses High Street at numbers 734 (even side) and 761 (odd side) as being in zone and is then along St Columbans Grove (all addresses in zone) to the Golf Course.

The Golf Course/Reserve is the boundary, across the Hutt River and SH2 to include addresses on the Western Hills. The boundary is such that Pomare Road addresses and Matuhi Street addresses are in zone. Tirihanga Road addresses 137 (odd side) and 114 (even side) and below are in zone. Kekeiro Grove addresses are all in zone, Opuere Grove addresses are not in zone. Wairere Road addresses and streets off Wairere Road are not in zone.

From the intersection of Tirihanga Road and SH2, the zone boundary is SH2 south to its intersection with the Melling Bridge (the starting point).
